On Sunday, January 23, 2022, Clerk of Session Jane Stephenson introduced Robert Lackie as a Preaching Associate for Central. An agreement has been made between Session and Bob for him to conduct worship on the second and fourth Sundays each month through May, as well as some special services. WELCOME, Bob!

It is bleak and cold as I look out my window, but every time I come to CPC I feel a welcoming warmth and am grateful to all of you for making it that way. I have been coming roughly once a month to do "pulpit supply" since July of last year, but beginning last month (January), I began a commitment to preach there twice a month, usually the "even" Sundays. I thought I might take a few paragraphs to familiarize you with my background.

My wife Lucy and I live in Springfield, and have since 1990. We have two grown children: a daughter Kate and son David, who is married since October 2020 to our beautiful daughter-in-law, Elodie. We live in between them all, with Kate up in Chicago and David and Elodie down in St. Louis. I attended Wheaton College, then the University of Illinois for graduate work, then worked for 32 years for BlueCross BlueShield of Illinois. Starting 4 years ago, I "scratched the itch" I have had most of my life to study the Bible more deeply, and began a Biblical Studies degree at Lincoln Christian Seminary. I was doing that part-time until early 2020, when I left BCBS. I also work part-time as a "TA" for the Greek class in the seminary, coaching students and grading their translations.

I never actually expected to go into preaching, as I see myself more a teacher than a preacher. However, in order to stretch myself and to help smaller churches whose pastors needed a weekend off, I signed up to do "pulpit supply." Before too long, I got an assignment to do it at CPC. Since July, I have come to really love the people, the wonderful worship there, and your engagement with the messages. Your worship elements, especially the reading of so much Scripture, hit me right in my "sweet spot." I also enjoy doing the "Young Disciples" time because, one, they are great kids, and two, it motivates me to distill my message into a core that they can (hopefully) understand.

I also am actively involved at our home church, Hope Church in Springfield, where I teach an adult Bible study (on the Sundays I don't come to CPC) and serve as an elder. My wife and I have been members there since 1991.

I am very excited to see where God takes CPC in 2022. I know it has been a rough season without a full-time pastor, but as you proceed in the search for one, I see how God has equipped the people there to take up the reins and serve. You are a real-life picture of what we see in Ephesians 4, and 1 Cor 12, where Paul talks about the working together of the Body of Christ through the gifts he provides. I am humbled to be able to play a small part in that!

- Income for 2021 was \$6,060.44 above budget and expenses are below budget by \$14,247.88, which put us below our overall budget. Regardless of budget, our income was \$19,536.50 above our expenses. Within Income, our Member Gifts are \$4,533.96 below budget. These are the monies that are received from members who do not do an annual pledge.
- Treasurer's report and financials were reviewed.
- General, MMF, and Endowment Funds were also reviewed.
- A draft budget for 2022 was completed by the Committee for submission to Session with pledges being up from 2021 with several new pledges being received. Overall, expenses are slightly lower than income. This is without a full-time minister and relying on pulpit supply.

- The new projector wiring and installation is in the works. Discussion was had regarding replacing the b/w camera at the back of the sanctuary with a color one.
- We are waiting for a bat removal person to look at our organ loft and bell tower.

The Menard County Food Pantry is open and staffed by volunteers on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m. To receive a food order, persons in need should contact the Menard County Community Services Office located in the Menard County Courthouse at 217-632-4412 in order to schedule an appointment to receive a food referral.

Diaper Bank Needs

The Diaper Bank, located at the Menard County Housing office, 101 W. Sheridan Rd., Petersburg, IL 62675, is currently not open to the public. However, if you are in need of any supplies, either visit in person (there is a doorbell at the front door) or call the office at 217-632-

7723. Office hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Senior Services Center is now in the Menard County Housing building, and they have a good supply of adult briefs and pads.

The Diaper Bank is currently well stocked with infant diapers. Rather than purchasing items to donate, a monetary donation is always accepted.

The Story Behind Valentine's Day February 14

Flowers, candy, pretty cards, gifts, love and romance in the air...that's what Valentine's Day is all about...right? At least, that's what the celebration has become in our modern-day society. What is the real story behind Valentine's Day?

Most sources believe that Saint Valentine's Day began with a feast in honor of an early Christian martyr named Valentinus and is celebrated in mid-February to coincide with his burial. Some believe



it may also be celebrated at this time in an effort to Christianize the pagan Roman celebration of Lupercalia – a fertility festival related to agriculture, while others deny this link.

The Legend

Saint Valentinus is remembered as a loving, compassionate and heroic person.

He was a priest during the time when the Emperor Claudius II was persecuting the church, around 250 AD. Claudias had issued an edict that young men were not to marry, as single men made better soldiers. They would not be distracted by thoughts and care of their loved ones, but could focus on their call to duty. In the very permissive society of that day (polygamy was popular), the church still viewed marriage as sacred between one man and one woman.

Valentinus believed those who were in love should be able to marry within the Christian church and remain monogamous. He defied the emperor's orders, and performed marriages in secret.

Valentinus was caught, imprisoned, tortured and eventually killed for performing forbidden marriages and for ministering to Christians. Legend is that while Valentinus was in prison, he prayed with and saw the healing of the blind daughter of his jailer Asterius. Asterius and his entire household are said to have come to Christian faith as a result. It is widely believed that before his execution, Valentinus wrote a farewell letter to Asterius' daughter signed "Your Valentinus." This was the first "valentine."

What It Means Today

The celebration of Saint Valentine's Day has evolved from sending letters, poems, and homemade paper valentines to loved ones to a lucrative business for card publishers, florists, chocolatiers, and jewelers.

While the celebration has become more materialistic, we can grasp the opportunity to show our love and concern for others through acts of kindness and compassion. We can share God's love with the world around us. We can make something good out of this special day.

What Does Valentine's Day Mean to You?

Father Frank O'Gara (Whitefriar Street Church in Dublin, Ireland) said that what Valentine's Day means to him "is that there comes a time where you have to lay your life upon the line for what you believe. And with the power of the Holy Spirit, we can do that—even to the point of death."

Take time to reflect on what Valentine's Day means, or can mean, to you.
